We are currently in the process of confirming speakers for the 2013 event, and the weekend promises a slate of provocative and lively speakers, including the following. For more information and updates see our website at www.asilomar.pbknca.org/

1. Back by popular demand, Ranger Roxann Jacobus will guide us through the grounds and buildings of Asilomar. She has spent many years researching the works of Julia Morgan, especially as they pertain to Asilomar. She leads a fascinating and enlightening tour that is a delight to everyone – those of us who have shared it with her many times in the past – as well as those who still regret having missed her talk in the past!

2. Dr. Keith Porter: a specialist in seismic vulnerability and earthquake risk models teaches Civil, Environmental and Architectural Engineering at the University of Colorado, Boulder.

3. Vanessa Raditz: From Political Rhetoric to Logistical Reality; How Clinics for the Underserved are Adjusting to the Challenges and Opportunities of the Affordable Care Act

Vanessa is a recent ΦBK grad from Smith College, and current intern at Petaluma Community Clinic. Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) in California and across the country are experiencing federal and state healthcare reform; she will give some examples of how local clinics are meeting these new challenges.

4. Sharon J. Roe: Arts of Afghanistan, Yesterday and Today

Sharon Roe, docent and lecturer at the San Francisco Asian Art Museum, will speak to us about the artistic traditions and practices of Afghanistan, and help us see how they are situated in the larger context of Afghan history and culture.

5. Dr. Joel Rudinow: The Spiritual Roots of the Blues

Joel is a blues pianist whose credits include touring with Elvin Bishop and release of his own CD, *Rude Notes Galore*. His presentation will share his unique perspective on the blues – perhaps peppered with lively demonstrations of the blues rhythms he loves to explore.

More speakers are now being scheduled, and will be announced on the web. However, as those of you who have attended our conference well know, the speakers are just one part of the experience. What makes the weekend special (besides the always gorgeous ocean setting just south of Monterey, of course) is the opportunity to get to know and mingle with our extraordinary members. 



Tour of the Oakland Aviation Museum – Saturday, January 19, 2013



From the early days of aviation until the start of World War II, the Oakland Airport was one of America's most significant airports. The Aviation Museum includes in its displays aircraft from the Wright Brothers Model EX to the Short Brothers Solent MKIII, the "flying boat". We will enjoy a docent-led tour of the Museum and learn the ins and outs of these early days of aviation. We will get a chance to appreciate where we started and how our aircraft developed over the years.

Stay in the right lane, crossing over Doolittle. Go under the Oakland International Airport banner and take the first exit on the right where the Earhart Road and Air Museum signs are visible. Follow Earhart Road approximately 7/8 mile to the Museum, right across from Hangar 6.

We Return to Mare Island – Wednesday, March 27, 2013



At the special request by many ΦBKNCA members, we will be returning to historic Mare Island for a docent-led visit. Our tour will include St. Peter's Chapel with its Tiffany stained glass windows, the Mare Island Artifact Museum, the Admiral's mansion, and the Colonial Revival era Officers' Row mansions. We will also be able to check out the dry docks along the waterfront of Mare Island Strait.

A bit of history: David Glasgow Farragut founded the Mare Island Shipyard in 1854 and the Navy closed the yard in 1996. During the active period, over 500 ships, including nuclear submarines, were built at Mare Island Naval Shipyard.


awards to deserving scholars and professors, with the objectives of enhancing the scholars' educational and research activities and honoring professors for their teaching of our next generation.
